"Growing new categories of specialty crops locally through advanced Agtech, can lead to numerous downstream agri-processing opportunities for local consumption and export, which can ultimately reduce our local food import bill and create Forex stimulating export advantages."

A 'luxury good' in high demand



- Current *fresh* strawberry imports: +/- 60,000 lbs/month (domestic)
- Forex drain: Approximately US\$5mm/year (US sourced + shipping)
- Local commercial farm supply: 0
- Estimated 40-50mm lbs/year regional frozen berry imports




Horticultural Limitations

- Requires 'temperate' climate conditions to grow outdoors in volume
- Pestilence control and water supply a major challenge
- Commercial farms mainly in US and Canada supply TT imports


